Your Privacy

We value your privacy and will keep information about you confidential in accordance with all relevant laws. This fact sheet details how we will collect, use and disclose your personal information throughout the Bruny Island Battery Trial.

Application Process

All information that you provide throughout the application process will be recorded by TasNetworks in accordance with their Privacy Policy, which has been developed to align with the Australian Privacy Principles under Federal Privacy Legislation. Subject to the exceptions provided for in legislation, your personal information will not be disclosed to another person without your consent. Participating in the Trial

Once selected to participate in the Trial and the Participation Agreement with TasNetworks has been signed, relevant information provided by participants will be shared with CONSORT project partners to develop better understanding of households trading stored electricity with the network. Personal information will be collected by TasNetworks for project purposes, by UTAS for research purposes and by REPOSIT and installers as part of their installation processes. All CONSORT project partners will collect, use, share and store personal information as per the Australian Privacy Principles (as described in the Federal Privacy Legislation), their respective Research and Development Program Funding Agreements with ARENA, and any individual contract with participants.

Any electricity consumption and generation data shared will be analysed by ANU, USyd and TasNetworks to better understand electricity network trading and how electricity pricing works in relation to this. ANU and USyd will generally work with de-identified information and data as they do not need personal information. Any personal information provided will be de-identified before it is published.

Social Research

The household research conducted with UTAS will mainly be analysed by UTAS researchers for the social research aspects of the Trial. All information provided will be made anonymous before it is published and will be kept secure in offices that can be locked and on password protected computers. Participants can request to view their recorded data at any time. Findings from analysis will be presented in project reports, papers and in presentations. In publications, information participants share will either be presented with an alias or with a participant number (to maintain anonymity). Limited personal information collected while conducting the research may be shared with CONSORT project partners, as detailed above.
